- Candidates must achieve a minimum overall mark of 65% to pass the programme.
- Assessment is split into three parts. Candidates must pass all three Assessments to pass the ARM Programme overall.

Assessment 1 (Assignment) A written assignment to be <u>submitted before</u> the start of the programme.
Assessment 2 (Workshop): 19-20 November 2024 (from 11.00 AM to 14.00 PM Cairo Time)
The candidates' knowledge in international Arbitration and interactive skills will be assessed in the workshop sessions through oral exercises.

Application Deadline and Entry Requirements:

- Number of the candidates is limited to 12.
- Please submit the Application Form no later than 17 October 2024.
- The Form should include a full CV and evidence of extensive knowledge in international arbitration via passing training programmes and/or practical experience working in the field of international arbitration.
- Selection of applicants eligible to register onto this Programme is based on reviewing the applicants' evidence of extensive knowledge of the framework and skills required to conduct an international arbitration
- Within one week following the applications submission, the Branch will contact the applicants eligible for the Programme to make the payment of the registration and final Exam fees.

Fees:

The Registration Fee amounts to 8000 EGP.

The Centralized Assessment (Final Exam) Fee amounts to total 189 GBP (174 GBP exam fee + 15 GBP transaction fee)

The fees include Registration for the programme, the **first attempt** at the assessments (Assessments 1, 2 and 3) and study materials.

These Fees do not include the fees of the re-sit assessment(s), if needed.

Programme Results:

Approximately twelve weeks from the date of submitting Assessment No. 3, Ciarb HQ will release a result sheet including candidates' marks of assessments 1, 2 and 3 and feedback from the centralised assessment.

- Successful candidates who pass all Assessments 1, 2 and 3 are eligible for the
 application for the MCiarb grade via the Ciarb HQ website. They will then
 receive a digital Member Grade certificate.
- Candidates who fail to pass any of Assessments 1, 2, or 3, will not be eligible for application for the Ciarb Membership grade. They should pass the re-sit

of the relevant Assessment under a subsequent ARM programme run by the Ciarb HQ or the Branch.
